
Truckers Against Trafficking exists to educate, equip, empower, and mobilize the trucking, bus, and energy industries to combat human trafficking as part of their regular jobs.

TRUCKERS AGAINST TRAFFICKING

Human trafficking is modern-day slavery. It is a global crime that happens in urban, suburban, and rural communities. There are millions of victims of modern-day slavery worldwide, including thousands in the U.S. and Canada.

Labor trafficking is when labor or services are induced through manipulation, threats, or violence. This includes debt bondage, forced labor, and involuntary child labor.

Sex trafficking is human trafficking for purposes of sexual exploitation, which includes prostitution and pornography. Victims of sex trafficking may act as if they are involved in commercial sex voluntarily when, in reality, they are being manipulated, threatened, or abused. Any minor involved in commercial sex is a victim of human trafficking.

Most victims of trafficking knew their trafficker in some way before their exploitation. Traffickers often groom their victims to win their love and trust or make false promises about work opportunities. By building bonds, traffickers gain additional control over

their victims, which they will often use in combination with violence, threats, and isolation.

Sex traffickers are motivated by greed and profit, so they often target locations and situations with large groups of men in order to find sex buyers.

Signs that someone may be a victim of human trafficking include:

- · lack knowledge of their whereabouts.
- are not in control of their identification documents.

- have their communication restricted or controlled, or
- are exchanging sex for anything of value.

You can play an important role in helping to combat human trafficking. There are some important things to understand about this crime:

- Human trafficking involves people being illegally bought and sold for forced labor or commercial sex.
- · Human trafficking occurs in all countries, including the U.S. and Canada, and all types of communities (urban, suburban

and rural).

- Victims of trafficking are often recruited and exploited in their home country, this includes U.S. and Canadian citizens. Trafficking and smuggling are different crimes.
- If you suspect human trafficking or prostitution, whether an adult or minor, inform the manager on duty and call 911. If you are talking with a suspected adult victim who wants help, call the national human trafficking hotline to access services:

The National Human Trafficking Hotline (NHTH) reports that in the past five years, over 41% of the cases truckers have reported involve victims who are minors.

Easy Breakfast Tortilla Pizza

INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 tablespoon butter, softened
- 110-inch tortilla
- · 3 large eggs
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup total assorted toppings, such as cheese, hot sauce, cooked meat or veggies

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F
- Rub butter along the bottom and sides of an 8or 9-inch cake pan.
- Press the tortilla down into the buttered pan and against the sides.
- Crack each egg next to each other on the tortilla.
- · Sprinkle with salt and pepper and add desired toppings evenly on top.
- Bake in the preheated oven until the egg whites are set and the tortilla has become lightly browned and toasted along the edges and bottom (about 13 to 15 minutes).




